**CONSTITUTION of the
Morgan Horse Association
of New Jersey, Inc.**

**Article I
NAME**

The name of this Association shall be: The Morgan Horse Association of New Jersey, Inc. (hereafter MHANJ).

**Article II
PURPOSE**

- A. To stimulate interest in the breeding, showing, and pleasure use of the Morgan Horse.
- B. To support the program of the American Morgan Horse Association.
- C. To provide a united voice and effort on behalf of the Morgan Horse.
- D. To promote good fellowship among Morgan Horse owners and friends of the breed.
- E. To provide activities for our youth.

**Article III
MEMBERSHIP AND DUES**

- A. Membership shall consist of Morgan Horse owners and those interested in the purposes of this club, regardless of place of residence.
- B. The types of membership are: Senior - 18 and over (one vote); Junior - under 18 (no vote); Life - (one vote); Family - (one vote).
- C. Dues shall be determined by a vote of the membership at the annual meeting and shall be made payable to the MHANJ and forwarded to the treasurer by ~~January 1st~~ **February 15th** of the current year.
 - 1. To be eligible for election to any office or to the Board, the person being considered must be a member in good standing ~~and must reside within the state of NJ.~~
 - 2. To be eligible for awards, either in the NJ Breeder awards or MHANJ awards, one must be a member in good standing and conform to any other rules of the MHANJ but need not necessarily be a New Jersey resident.

**Article IV
THE EXECUTIVE BOARD**

- A. The Executive Board shall consist of the current President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Equine Advisory Board Delegate and alternate, Horse Council Delegate and alternate, two representatives for the membership at large, and five trustees, who shall be chosen by ballot. Two past Presidents shall also serve, preferably the two most immediate, provided that they are willing and able to serve and have not been elected to serve in some other capacity.
 - 1. The Board shall supervise the administration of the MHANJ, and each member of the Board shall have one vote.
 - 2. The term of office of each elected member of the Board shall be two years, except that the five trustees shall serve a term of four years.
 - 3. Elections shall be held in the odd numbered years.
 - 4. In the event that any Board office becomes vacant for any reason, the ~~Board~~ **President** shall appoint a replacement.
- B. The duties of the officers shall be:

The President shall preside at all meetings; sign all legal documents, except checks, **and** along with Secretary and/or Treasurer, appoint all committees, except the nominating committee, and call any special meetings of the club or Executive Board.

- 1. The Vice-President shall exercise the power or duties of the President in his/her absence.
- 2. The Secretary shall post notices to members, record official proceedings, keep a correct and complete account of each member, retain the records of the Association, and carry on all correspondence of the MHANJ.
- 3. The Treasurer shall keep a complete account of finances, collect and hold all monies accruing from dues, and pay bills when approved **by the President or one other club officer.**
- 4. The Equine Advisory Board Delegate shall represent the MHANJ at all EAB meetings and shall be empowered to speak with the authority of the club.
- 5. The Horse Council Delegate shall represent the Association at all Horse Council meetings and shall be empowered to speak with the authority of the club.
- 6. The alternate delegate shall serve as the representative should the regular delegate be unable to attend a meeting.

**Article V
THE COMMITTEES**

- A. The President shall appoint all committees, except the Nominating Committee, that are necessary to carry on the business of the club.
 - 1. The Nominating Committee: Either at or prior to the annual meeting on even years, the Secretary shall take a list of those willing to serve on the Nominating Committee. At the first Executive Board meeting following the annual meeting, the Board shall select a committee of 5 to 11 members who have submitted their names to serve for the coming election.
 - 2. The Auditing Committee shall consist of at least three members appointed each year by the President. It shall be the duty of this committee to audit the records of this Association, which shall be maintained by the Treasurer, and to render its report at each annual meeting.

**Article VI
ELECTIONS**

- A. Following a report of the Nominating Committee, further nominations from the floor shall be accepted, providing said nominee has previously agreed to his nomination.
- B. Eligibility of all candidates shall be confirmed by the Secretary.
- C. Eligibility of all voting members shall be confirmed by the Secretary, i.e., that they are members of the club and in good standing.

**Article VII
THE MEETINGS**

- A. The MHANJ shall meet at least once a year, meeting dates and location to be decided upon by the Board and/or President with the annual meeting called prior to ~~December 31st~~ **February 15th** each year.
- B. The order of business at the annual meeting shall be:

- C. At all meetings a quorum shall be deemed present when one-fourth of the voting membership is present in person or proxy.
- D. The membership shall be notified in writing at least 14 days prior to a meeting and shall receive a proxy with this notice.

**Article VIII
THE FISCAL YEAR**

The fiscal year of the corporation shall begin on April 1st and end on March 31st.

**Article IX
DISSOLUTION OF THE ASSOCIATION**

In the event of the dissolution of the MHANJ any assets shall go to the American Morgan Horse Institute Educational and Charitable Trust.

**Article X
AMENDMENTS**

These By-laws may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of members represented at the meeting provided a two-week notice of the proposed amendment has been given to all members of the Association.

The 2010 New York Morgan AMHA Regional Championship Show's show theme is "Celebrating the First Fifty Years" which captures both our history and our future. We are pleased to announce the following have agreed to officiate: Main Ring: Jennifer Sommers and Terry Jones Brennan; John MacDonald will join them Friday evening on Sweepstakes night as the Stallion Service Auction call judge. Carriage will be judged by John Greenall, and the Dressage will be judged by Scott Petersen. Many surprises are planned for the show. More information at www.nysmhs.org. We hope you mark your calendars and plan to join us in Syracuse at the New York Morgan Show, September 15-18, 2010.

A. ELIGIBILITY

1. Any Morgan is eligible for Year End Awards if it is:
 - a. Registered with the AMHA or (if a weanling) eligible to be registered, and
 - b. Owned or leased in whole or in part by a member of the MHANJ, and
 - c. Registered with the Points Secretary (See section 3a).
2. Any junior member is eligible for Year End Awards if he/she is registered with the Points Secretary (see Sec. 3b).
3. Points will be recorded:
 - a. Registration for points will be accepted anytime up to November 1 at \$10 per horse and can be submitted with your registration form as long as the owner or lessee is a current member of MHANJ.
 - b. Only after the junior member is recorded with the Points Secretary on a registration form and a \$5 annual fee is paid.
 - c. When notification is made to the Points Secretary of all placings in a show on the completely filled out appropriate form and postmarked by November 1. Points received after that time will not be counted.
4. Awards will be made:
 - a. To the horse or rider with the highest points in each award category. In case of a tie both will receive the award.
 - b. To the owner or lessee at the time the last points are earned as long as they are also members of the MHANJ.

B. POINT SCORING SYSTEM

1. Only 10 shows will count. Unless the Points Secretary is notified by November 1 which shows are to be counted, the Secretary will select the 10 shows.
2. Categories and point counts
 - a. USEF A rated Morgan or open shows will count as A, USEF B rated Morgan or open shows and USDF and ADS-rated shows will count as B, USEF C rated Morgan or open shows and non-rated shows as D.

POINTS SHALL BE AWARDED AS FOLLOWS:

3. Point Scoring Rules:
 - a. Full points will be credited where all horses have an equal scoring opportunity.
 - b. Grand Champion and Reserve classes will earn championship and reserve points.
 - c. Half points:
 - i. Classes that exclude any horse or rider, where not offset by comparatively exclusive classes, e.g. maiden, novice, limit, childrens, ladies (unless, for example, ladies will count full if there is a gentlemen class; under 15H will count full if there is an over class.)
 - ii. Amateur, classic pleasure, junior horse and junior exhibitor will count full points, but only towards the Amateur, Classic Pleasure, Junior Horse, and Jr. Exhibitor awards.

- d. Versatility Award—All Morgan classes at recognized shows in which the horse is judged but which do not clearly fit into any other category.
- e. Promotion Award—Morgan classes at non-approved shows and classes open to breeds other than just Morgans at both approved and non-approved shows:
 - i. No points will be counted unless the exhibitor:
 - ii. Submits results within 3 weeks, and
 - iii. Submits a prize list with entry attested by a show official
 - iv. 4-H and pony club shows will not count.
 - v. Points will be awarded as for "C" Regular classes as described in the points table above
- f. Pleasure Trail/Pathways (non-competitive trail based on hour) -Honor system of MHANJ members keeping track of hours spent in the saddle or driving any MHANJ Morgan(s) nominated for Year-End Awards, outside of the show ring/training ring. The horse/rider combination must be registered at the beginning of the year. Patches with MHANJ logo to be given out at 100h, 200h, 300h, and up at 100-hr increments. At the end of the Year-End Awards season, the 6 highest rider/drivers/horse combination will be awarded Champion through 6th place for the Pleasure Trail Year Award.
- g. Equitation points will count only if ridden on a registered Morgan.
- h. 4-H Award: Any classes that do not fit into the awards categories as defined will be counted toward Promotion.
- i. No points:
 - i. Where the class cannot be entered on the show's regular closing date, i.e. futurities.
 - ii. Where membership is required in any organization (except equitation medal classes and competitive trail) other than the MHANJ.
 - iii. Where residence is required in an area other than NJ.
 - iv. Classes where the horse does not work at all the usual gaits, e.g., walk-trot (with the exception of Junior Exhibitor Walk/Trot Pleasure).
- j. Any question concerning scoring not covered above will be decided by the Rules Committee.

2010 BREEDER AWARD RULES

A. Eligibility

1. Definition of a NJ Bred Morgan:
 - a. Any foal dropped in the State of NJ, except for those dropped by a mare arriving in the state for the sole purpose of foaling.
 - b. The get of any Stallion standing only in NJ during the breeding season of the year in which the foal was conceived. A Stallion standing in NJ must breed only in NJ for any yearly breeding season and **MUST NOT BE BRED OUT OF NJ** during that year, though he may be trained and shown elsewhere.
 - c. Foals resulting from the transport of semen from a Stallion standing the full season in the State of NJ will be considered a NJ Bred, providing blood typing of the stallion, mare and foal is carried out to authenticate parentage and semen transport is agreeable to the national registry of the breed.
 - d. Foals resulting from an embryo transfer from a mare, standing the full season, in the State of NJ, will be considered NJ Bred, providing blood typing of the mare, stallion and foal is carried out to authenticate parentage and embryo transfer is agreeable to the national registry of the breed.
2. A Morgan is eligible for NJ Breeder Awards if:
 - a. It is an eligible NJ Bred Morgan (See previous), **and**
 - b. It is registered with the AMHA or (if a weanling) eligible to be registered.
 - c. The horse is owned or leased in whole or in part by a member of the MHANJ (who need not reside in the State of NJ).
 - d. The horse's AMHA registration papers and leases are recorded with the MHANJ Points Secretary, Patricia Mann, 2 White Birch Rd., Stanhope, NJ 07874, phone: 973-347-4372, and a \$10 fee that covers both the Breeder and Year End Awards be paid annually.
 - e. The horse is entered and judged in his particular class with at least one other horse at the New Jersey All Breed Horse Show.
 - f. If the animal is the only horse in his particular class, he will not receive points but will receive credit for having shown at the All Breed Show. He will also receive the 1st place show prize money.

B. New Jersey All Breed Horse Show

1. In 2008, classes will be judged by two judges. It is therefore necessary for the Morgans to show at the Jersey Classic Horse Show or Children's Benefit at the Horse Park of NJ to give us the third judge required.

4. At the New Jersey All Breed Horse Show **NO MEDICATION OF ANY KIND IS PERMITTED.**
 5. **In 2010, the horse show will be held on Sunday, September 18.** Prize lists will be mailed to all current MHANJ members.
 6. Prize lists may be obtained from the New Jersey Department of Agriculture, 609-292-2888, or All Breed Horse Show Secretary, NJ Department of Agriculture, Division of Markets-Equine, PO Box 330, Trenton, NJ 08625.

C. Year End Breeder Awards

1. The number of horses that exhibit at the New Jersey All Breed Horse Show will determine our share of the money offered as Breeder Awards.
2. To qualify all horses **MUST** be shown at the New Jersey All Breed Show and Jersey Classic.
3. The Breeder Award money will be divided equally among all categories and will be allotted as follows:

1st Place	40%	4th Place	10%
